# Data Innovation Project *Applied Research Fellowship*

## Organization Application 2025–2026

This application is for community organizations that wish to host a Data Innovation Project Applied Research Fellow for the 2025–2026 academic year. To learn more about the program visit the Data Innovation Project [website](#).

For the 2025–2026 academic year, the DIP will be selecting **up to five fully subsidized** Applied Research Fellows to work with local community organizations. This year, the fellowships program will follow a hybrid model; while some DIP-led trainings and meetings may be held in-person, selected organizations can help to determine the best format for their fellows.

## Responsibilities

Community organizations should be prepared to host a research fellow for 10 hours a week during the academic year (30 weeks in total between September 2025 – May 2026). Each month, about three hours of the fellow's time will be spent at DIP-run workshops and peer group meetings. Host sites are expected to oversee the student's time and

manage their work to ensure project milestones and deliverables are met. In considering hosting a fellow, it is important that community organizations plan for additional staff time to manage, support, and supervise a fellow.

## **Eligibility**

Organizations must be based in Maine to receive a fellow.

Organizations must be mission-driven, but don't have to be not-for-profit.

## **Scope of Work**

To ensure a successful placement, interested community organizations must compile a clear and detailed project proposal using this [PROPOSAL TEMPLATE](#). The proposed project should focus primarily on applied research and evaluation work that is appropriate for a graduate student.

This can include but is not limited to:

- Collecting data (e.g. design and conduct a survey, conduct focus groups or interviews)
- Compiling and analyzing data (surveys, interviews/focus groups, database metrics, population-level data like the Census)
- Designing logic models or other evaluation materials
- Drafting a program monitoring plan
- Conducting literature reviews
- Data entry and cleaning

## **Selection Criteria**

Host sites will be selected based on:

- Site's organizational capacity to support and supervise a fellow.

- A well-defined and articulated scope of work, with clear project goals and deliverables that are in line with the objectives of the fellowship program.
- The extent to which the site has a clear plan for offering support and supervision to the fellow, either virtually or in-person.
- The extent to which the proposed work matches a selected graduate student's skills and interests is also considered in the selection process.

## Deadline

The deadline to apply for a 2025–2026 Applied Research Fellow is **Friday, June 6, 2025**. Final decisions and notifications to selected organizations are expected mid-July.
